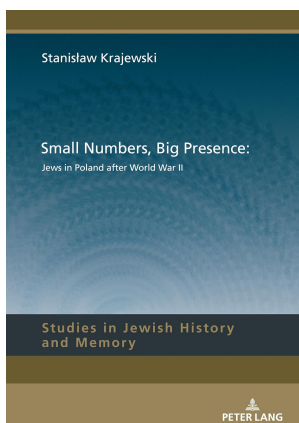

Stanisław Krajewski, professor of philosophy at the University of Warsaw, published on logic, philosophy of mathematics, philosophy of interfaith dialogue, and Jewish experience. Founding co-chairman of the Polish Council of Christians and Jews, co-author of the post-war section of the exhibition in POLIN, the Museum of the History of Polish Jews in Warsaw. *Small Numbers, Big Presence: Jews in Poland after World War II* was published by Peter Lang in 2024.



Stanisław Krajewski has played a unique role in the history of Polish Jews, both in the struggle to democratize Poland after 1968 and in the attempt since 1990 to revitalize Jewish life in the new conditions of pluralism and open discussion. In this path-breaking book, he reflects on the evolution of Polish Jewry in these years against the background of its enormous contribution to Jewish religious traditions and its tragic fate in the Holocaust.
